

ACCEPTED MATERIAL



Concrete

- Includes sidewalk, curb, gutter and concrete building material of any size.
- Rebar/mesh within the concrete is acceptable with maximum 6" of rebar exposed.
- Loads must not be mixed and cannot contain trash, soil, green waste, or asphalt.



Painted Concrete and Asphalt

- Accepted if it is not lead-based and must be tested prior to recycling.
- Loads must not be mixed or contain trash, soil, green waste, or asphalt.



Asphalt

 Loads must not be mixed and cannot contain trash, concrete, soil, or green waste.



Rock and Dirt

- All sizes of rock are acceptable.
- Loads must not contain trash, green waste, concrete, or asphalt.



Bricks, Concrete and Cement Roof Tile

 Loads must not be mixed or contain trash, soil, green waste, or asphalt.



Concrete Washout

- Loads cannot contain liner.
- Loads must not be mixed or contain trash, soil, green waste, or asphalt.



UNACCEPTABLE MATERIAL - INCLUDES BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE FOLLOWING:



Green Waste and Contaminated Soil

- Includes branches, grass, trees, twigs, and other green waste.
- Loose soil within the load will not be accepted unless seperated, tested and not contaminated.



Metal

 Includes metal pieces, such as metal posts or beams. However, rebar contained within concrete is acceptable.



Trash

 Includes food waste and any items collected by municipal trash companies.



Material Coated with Lead-Based Paint

• Paint that contains 5,000 parts per million lead or greater.



Hazardous Materials

 Includes asbestos-containing material, polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), infectious waste, and radioactive materials.
